

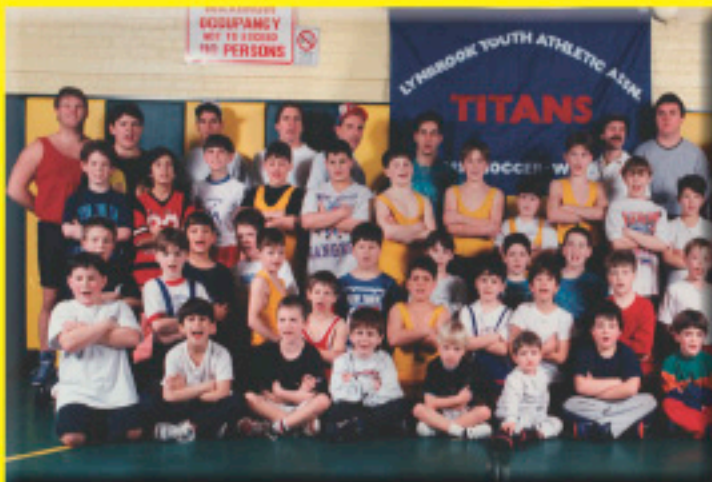
KEVIN MURPHY

King of Lynbrook Kid Wrestling

Kevin Murphy was an outstanding high school wrestler at Lynbrook High School. He capped his career by winning the 132 lb. Nassau County title in 1978. Kevin went on to the University of Massachusetts. He wrestled there for four years and emerged as a three-time finalist in the Division 1 New England Championships. In 1982 he was the 142 lb. New England Champion and qualified for the Division 1 NCAA Championships.

Kevin has distinguished himself as a positive role model. He motivates hundreds of young wrestlers who are going through the Lynbrook Youth Wrestling Program. It is because of his enthusiasm, commitment, and hard work ethic with the young wrestlers of Lynbrook that the high school varsity program is competitive in Nassau county.

Kevin has volunteered and donated countless

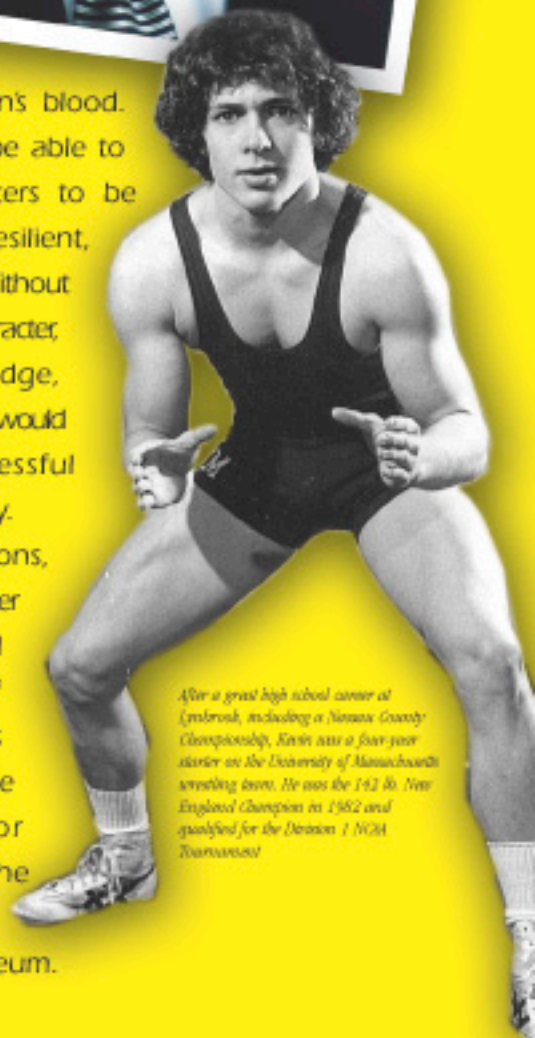


Kevin Murphy has dedicated countless hours to the Lynbrook kid wrestling program. Programs like this are critical to the success and growth of wrestling on Long Island.
